Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the end of our Summer Term, it is lovely to see the sun shining brightly, and the weather giving us every opportunity to get outside. LATCH

Suncream

As the sun is now shining, can I please give a reminder about applying suncream to your child before school. We would recommend factor 50, once a day cream to ensure that your child is fully protected from the sun. We would also recommend that pupils wear a sun hat, and if necessary a light long sleeved item of clothing which may be worn on the yard. We do not have staff available to supervise pupils applying suncream or apply suncream for pupils, and therefore all suncream must be applied before the start of the school day. This year once again we will be having a Risca University Week, where all children are given the opportunity to have a week in 'University' completing a University course. New Parents Meeting

We will be holding a meeting for new pupils to our school on Tuesday 27th June. The meeting is intended for parents of pupils who next year will be in our Nursery, Reception and year 3 classes. We also welcome the parents of our current Year 2 pupils, should parents wish to have a refresher meeting, and should they wish to view our Year 3 classrooms. Moving Up Day

On June 29th we will be having our moving up day, where all children will be able to meet their new teacher. Please be aware that pupils will not know their class until the actual moving up day. On the morning of the 29th we will meet and greet all pupils in their current class and move them up to their new teacher.

Personalised Assessments

In line with Welsh Government Guidance we will be administering pupil Personalised Assessments (formally known as National tests) on the weeks beginning Monday 19th June and Monday 26th June. The tests are now all online and all children from Year 2 to

Year 6 are required to take part in the assessments. This year, pupils are only required to undertake two tests; a reading test and a maths procedural test. These will be done over the course of the two weeks. They will be completed in class, as a part of the school day.

New Library Card

Congratulations to Lennon in Year 5 who won a competition run by The Caerphilly Library service, to design their new library card. 40,000 new cards featuring Lennon's design have been printed and will be issued to all new library applications made by children. It can also be issued to adults if they request it! Well done Lennon!

Fixed Term Penalty Notices

As you know we work very hard at Risca Primary School to ensure that all children attend school regularly. Mr Bills is our Attendance Officer and he is always keen to work with families, to ensure that all children have good attendance. We know that when children attend school regularly they have the very best chance to do well when they are with us. We also know that when children's attendance is erratic, they find it hard to make up for missed time and as a result their attainment in school can suffer. Therefore as a school, we are happy to work with you to ensure that we can get the best attendance possible for each and every child.

When working with parents we aim to support you in as many ways as possible, and when necessary to seek support from other agencies, such as health if necessary. We find that on the whole our support is very successful, and we regularly work well with families to improve pupil attendance. However, in a small number of cases, we continue to have some pupils whose attendance is very poor. In these circumstances, if we have given support to families and pupil attendance has still not improved, we will now consider issuing fixed penalty notices to parents. This is in line with the Education Act of 1996, which states that 'If a child of compulsory school age who is a registered pupil at a school fails to attend regularly at the school, or fails to attend regularly at alternative provision, the child's parent/guardian is guilty of an offence under s.444 Education Act 1996'.

Please be aware that we absolutely do not wish to issue Fixed penalty Notices, and this will always be a last resort, however, as a school we also have an obligation to ensure that pupils are able to access their entitlement to education, to ensure that they do their very best whilst in school, and maximise their life opportunities.
